


Helpers from Frazee School's Day of Caring. They did a great job with cleaning up the church grounds and cleaning ditches with the Men's group.

Ad Council Minutes Vergas United Methodist Church May 21, 2025, 6:30 pm in person at church

Present: Jane Wasvick, Sheri Schoenberger, Faye Courneya, David Reiten, Renee Sonnenburg, and

Doreen Schwarzrock Absent: Joyce Slostad

Jane opened the meeting with prayer.

Review of Church Attendance

Sheri stated that attendance has remained steady. In person has seen 24-25 with stronger Easter. Online is around 50 and seems to be increasing.

Secretary Report

The minutes of the April meeting were approved as distributed.

Treasurer Report

- The Treasurer report was accepted as handed out pending audit.
- FDIC covers savings, checking, and CD's up to \$250,000. All assets are in the Vergas Bank totaling greater than that amount. As the current CD's become due, there will be an evaluation of where the money should be banked. This will be discussed in November.

Trustee Report

- David has been ill and will contact Zitzow Electric to take out the alarm.
- Doreen asked about the shed which is falling down and needs to be replaced. Consensus was to give this to the Men's Group to consider as their items are stored there.

Pastor Report:

Pastor Joyce was ill and couldn't attend the meeting.

Mission

The Missions of the Quarter for 2025.

1st Quarter, UMCOR

2nd Quarter, Relay for Life

3rd Quarter, Churches United Homeless Mission

4th Quarter, Local Food Shelves, Perham, Pelican Rapids, and Detroit Lakes

- Joyce found two Methodist churches that were destroyed by the California fires so we will decide how we use the dollars at the May meeting. Since UMCOR is the first quarter Mission, we will see the total that is collected and then add it to the money that Iona left to the church. Joyce will investigate how we can contact the church directly. Congregation giving for this mission is \$5316.63 so far and the Lenten coins will be added to this fund. Tonya made the motion to send \$10,000 to one of these churchs or \$5000 to each one depending on what Joyce can find out about the situation. Jane seconded and the motion was passed.
- Local mission dollars for June were tabled as no issues were brought up.

Shops and Hops

Jane discussed the current status of the signup sheet for Shops and Hops. Plenty of people were willing to donate items to sell, but not enough people were willing to come and man the booth. The Church Ladies suggested that we do not participate in Shops and Hops but use the idea of individually packed snacks to sell at the Rummage Sale during Looney Days. The Ad Council agreed with this suggestion, and this will be added to the signup sheet for Looney Days.

Fellowship

The decision to purchase rolls once a month is costly, about \$54. Faye made a motion to just have coffee available and no treats for the summer, seconded by David and passed. This decision will be reevaluated in the fall.

Snow Removal

Snow removal is provided by Carl Hoffman and by Franklin Fence when the timing is right. Tonya made a motion to pay Carl \$250 for snow removal, seconded by Faye and approved.

Day Care Use of Church

Jane and Faye met with two people who were hired by Vergas City to explore daycare options in the community. They are through the CEDA, Community and Economic Development Association. They will do all the work to assess the feasibility and the cost of using the church basement for this purpose. They would also pursue grants for any building construction. They will report back to Ad Council their collected information. No decisions will be made without the approval of the church. The Fire Marshall did not agree to do an audit of the church so this will be done by the CEDA.

Computer Upgrade

- Sheri reported on what Jody has suggested to be purchased to replace existing hardware. The office computer would cost \$479 and the audio/visual computer would cost \$750. The current subscriptions would follow the hardware. Doreen made a motion for Jody to proceed with the purchase, seconded by David, and passed.
- Sheri also suggested deleting the video access for \$300 as it is not used, all agreed.

Spring Work

Mark began to look at the work that needed to be done and met with a landscaper and cement person. He submitted a bid on the project. Tonya presented the bid for the work to be done to seal the basement and the concrete work to follow. The bid was obtained from Do-Right Construction who did work in the church recently. The total was \$15,441.31 for the project. Doreen made a motion to accept the bid, seconded by David, and passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned.

The next meeting will be on June 18th in person at the Church.
